



Hi, I'm William and I am an artist who has been painting off and on all of my life. I have been motivated to create art all of my life. I tend to be a person who takes an interest in interesting visual details all around me. So many times I have tried and capture some of the imagery around me by either photograph or painting. I have been drawing, painting and creating art since I was a little dude. I had many of years where I turned my art into a graphic design business. I also had many years where life just got in the way of doing what I ultimately loved to do the most, which is painting with oils. I've tried other mediums, Acrylics, Colored Pencils, Watercolor, but seem to always love working with oils the best. So in the last few years I've recently went back to painting with oils which



is my first passion.

I lived in Thousand Oaks, California most of my life and then in 2010 moved to Las Vegas and painted as much as possible when I was there. I recently moved to Washington, Utah. I would say that my paintings reflect my love of traditional art and painting realistic images. I've recently been developing more of a Surrealistic style to my work and am always trying to find interesting subject matter and composition that fits my personal style. The most interesting aspect of painting is how to manipulate the paint and color to reflect the light and shadows, which makes the subject come to life. So, most of my work is somewhat tight brush strokes and laying down lots of details within lights and shadows trying to make the subject matter look somewhat realistic. 





I hope you'll join us - we have serious fun!



4-Week Acrylic Open Studio / Darcy Lee Saxton January 6, 13, 20, & 27 (Mondays) @ 1pm - 4pm

Do you enjoy painting with acrylic but desire instructor guidance and feedback along with a supportive classroom environment? If so, kickstart your new year with new creativity in our acrylic open studio! This four-week open studio is for you to create the work of your choosing, at your own pace, with individually tailored instructor guidance based on your needs and preferences. Join us to further your skills, explore possibilities, and nurture your artistic expression regardless of where you are in your art-making journey!

Intermediate Watercolor: 4-Week Series / Michael Tabor

January 9, 16, 23, and 30 (Thursdays) @ 9am -12 pm

Dive deeper into the world of watercolor painting with our intermediate class. This four-week course is designed for artists who have learned the fundamentals of watercolor and are ready to elevate their skills. Explore color mixing and advanced painting techniques, while also experimenting with creating organic textures and effects. Advance your composition skills and learn a tried and true formula for building a successful painting.

Art for the Analytical Mind - Exploring Sacred Geometry, Papermaking, and Bookbinding / Andrew Kosorok January 9, 16, 23 and 30 (Thursdays) @ 2pm - 5pm

Come learn the fundamentals of sacred geometry, papermaking, and marking, as we dive into book making in this unique workshop with local expert, Andrew Kosorok. Over four classes, we will create several books of different styles, as well as a traditional Japanese-style binding sketchbook. These creations will include a chopstick sketchbook, an accordion book bound with masking tape, a sketchbook sewn with yarn, and a pocket abcedaria plus more! In the last class we will bind a fancyschmancy Japanese style book with decorative stitching, using our marbled paper from the first class.

2-Day Mixed-Media Workshop: Journey from Representation to Abstract / Denise Vance January 10 and 11 (Friday and Saturday) @ 10am -1pm

Join us for two, fun-filled days of exploratory, intuitive, abstract mixed-media art making! In this unique workshop with local artist Denise Vance, we







will allow our brush to do more than merely paint a picture, but rather, to craft a whole new world filled with individuality and personal vision. Abstract art liberates artists from traditional norms, encouraging exploration in color, form, and texture. This workshop will explore these concepts through creative exercises, including various painting mediums and collages. The final portion of the workshop will culminate in the creation of a unique, abstract, 16×20 mixed-media art piece. No prior experience is necessary, and all art-making supplies are included!

Introduction to Oil Painting for Beginners: 4-Week Session / Matt Pectol

4-Week Session starting January 1/18, 1/25, 2/1, 2/8 (Saturdays) @ 1pm - 5pm

There is nothing quite like painting with oils, and for those of us who love it, it's truly an addiction! If you're curious about oil painting or new to art in general, this class is perfect!

Led by talented local artist and teacher, Matt Pectol, you will quickly become familiar with the painting studio as you explore various techniques, methods, and materials. Over this four-week session, you will learn:

- All about the materials (paints, mediums, surfaces, brushes)
- How to work with a limited color palette
- Basic color mixing
- How to layout and sketch a painting
- Techniques for painting from a photo

If you are a more experienced oil painter, consider joining Matt's oil painting studio classes on Monday mornings starting January 6.

Abstract Alcohol Ink / Leslie Wignall DeBry January 22, 2025 (Wednesday) @ 1pm - 3pm

Join artist Leslie Wignall DeBry as she guides you through the process of creating a beautiful and unique masterpiece using alcohol inks. Students will learn a variety of techniques and methods as they work with this exciting medium. The process involves applying highly pigmented ink to paper, then adding isopropyl alcohol, which activates the ink to move and flow. This type of painting is therapeutic and relaxing for the mind and soul. Each painting is unique, and will be created on a 12×12 inch synthetic paper specifically designed for alcohol ink. This class is for all artistic ability levels. All supplies provided.







Fun with Acrylic Pour / Darcy Lee Saxton January 25 (Saturday) @ 9am - 12pm

Join us for art play and exploration as we learn the basics of working with fluid acrylic. This medium is wonderful for anyone wanting to try something new and get their creative juices flowing. In this class, we will overview the elements and principles of design as we create small acrylic pour paintings. All ability levels are welcome and all supplies will be provided. Walk away with beautiful high gloss acrylic paintings to keep or gift, plus the know-how to do it all again! For returning students, this class can be treated as an open studio.
