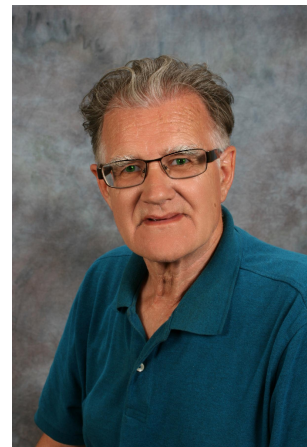
Who We Are. What we do for you.

Red Cliff Gallery is a teaching gallery that welcomes artists of all skill levels - beginners to professionals. For artists who have never entered your work into a gallery before, Red Cliff Gallery offers the experience of having to meet the entry standards into a gallery because our classes and written standards are similar to other galleries. Learning to enter and professionally present your work will increase your chances of being accepted into other galleries.

The Arrowhead Gallery is a juried gallery where artists submit a selection their work to a jury of judges. If accepted, they will be part of the gallery cooperative where artists share of the responsibility of the gallery.

We also have Events where members meet and receive critiques, demonstrations of various art techniques, and art business instruction. We encourage artists to volunteer to give demonstrations for the benefit of other Guild members.

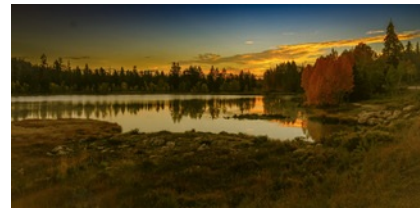


River, Wyoming.

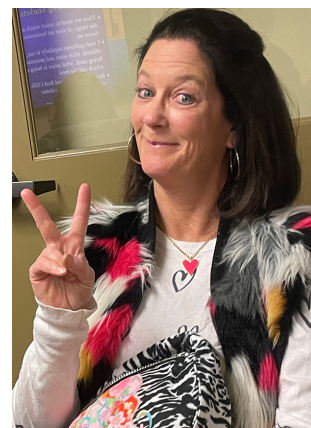

MJ Grow February Artist of the Month

As a colorist Mary Jane Grow finds that light her overall goal. Whether it's sunny or overcast the light to a plein air artist like Mary Jane is what is most important.

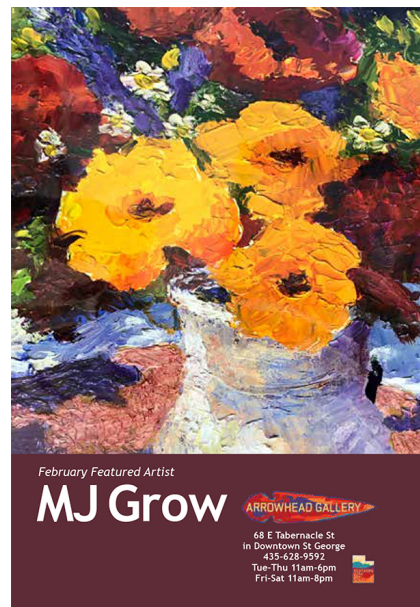
She has studied with plein air artist Camille Przewodek

for 8 years in workshops and online classes. She learned from Camille to simplify her approach and not to get into the details right away but search to get your "big notes" or color relationships working so you can achieve the correct light key in your oil painting. You can find her painting outside near the gallery or old buildings around town or out in the fields.

She also has studied watercolor starting as a youth at about age 11 with a lady in her neighborhood while she was growing up in Holladay UT. Mary Jane states, "DeAna McDonald was my first teacher and she started us out with watercolor so its never been a scary art medium for me." Mary Jane says, "I am sad when people say they don't want to do watercolor because you can't erase the paint. It's fun to see what happens and then take advantage of that also it's easy to take with you wherever you go."

Mary Jane offers watercolor classes at Arrowhead Gallery for free from time to time to children ages 9 through 12 to pass on what she loves to the younger generation. Supplies are included.

Adults can take lessons from her at her home in Ivins or Provo UT. She is mostly here in the St. George area during the winter as a "sun bird" she says. If you are interested in signing up for classes contact her through her website www.mjgrow.com



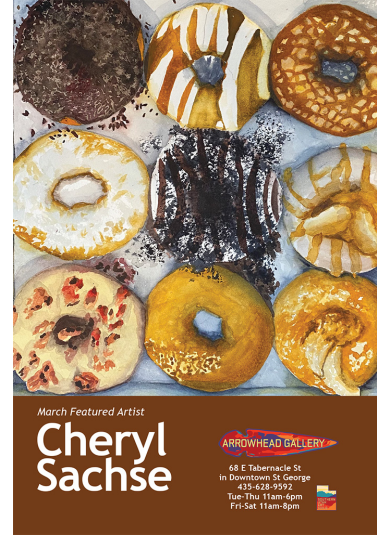
