PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

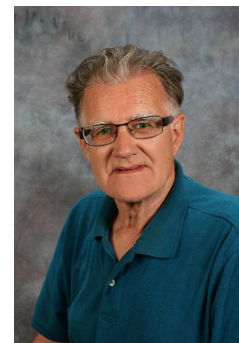
We are growing!

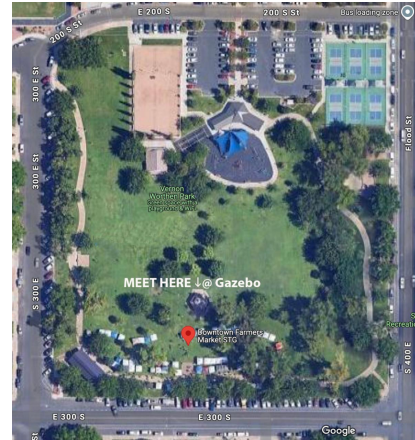
Vernon Worthen Park hosts the

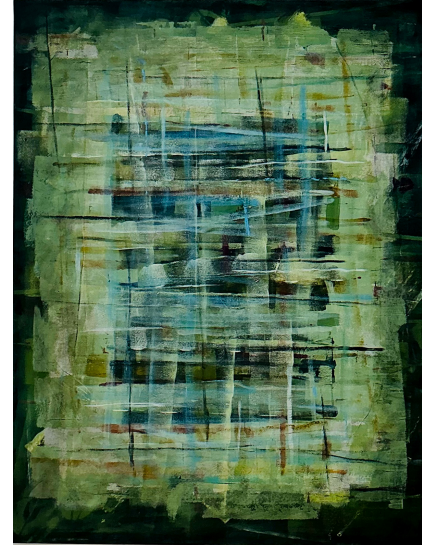

Rorie Tafoya

I am a native Utahn raised in Salt Lake City. I now live in the beautiful red rocks of St. George, Utah. I am a multi-medium artist because I like the looks of all mediums. Alcohol Ink, Watercolor, Acrylic, Oils, Graphite and Pastel. My favorite is Alcohol Ink because of its bold color, fast drying and fun to see the chemistry working in real time.

My passion for art began as a child. Learning the fundamentals from my uncle who would sit with my cousin and I teaching us how to draw



boxes and cylinders and how to shade and do shadows. I loved my Jr. High School and High School art classes. Then came life and my daughters.

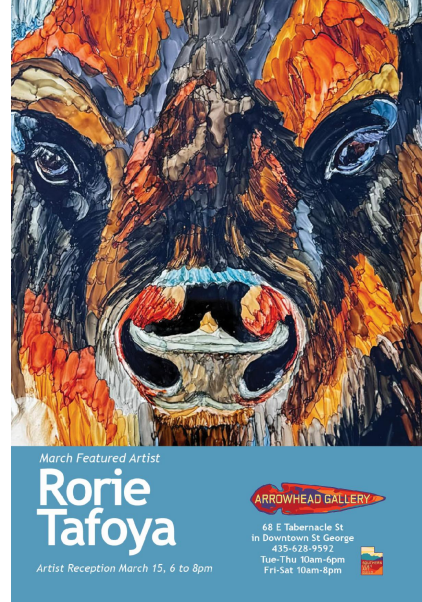
I always wanted to learn more. A young mother with three daughters I enrolled at Salt Lake Community College. I received my associate degree in Illustration and Design.

I moved to Logan; Utah where I gained employment at a sock manufacture as a designer. I was designing and creating socks. I promoted to Design department manager and sales manager of the custom program. After eight years I moved back to Salt Lake City and married my husband. His job took him to Wyoming for eighteen months. I stepped away from art for a while. When we moved back to Utah, we both wanted sunshine and warmth. We put the pin in the map for St. George and in October 2017 moved here to the beautiful red rocks.

I decided to take out the paints and start creating for myself just to decompress. I was not confident enough to show anyone my paintings except my husband. His encouragement and support gave me more confidence with every new painting.

My passion for art ignited once again. I took out the paints, practiced with different mediums, different techniques, I was doing what I loved and what makes my heart happy. A new way to decompress.

I enjoy the beauty of nature the world has to offer. My artwork influenced by animals, natures landscape and oceans. Small or large, dandelions in the wind to ocean waves crashing and wild horses galloping below large red cliffs. That is what makes me happy. I love the work



of Georgia O'Keefe and the influence of American Modernism and the contemporary style of Gerardo Labarca.

I have taught art classes here in St George using Alcohol Ink, Watercolor and Acrylic.



New Arrowhead Artist Paulette Schermerhorn, Fiber Artist

Paulette Schermerhorn is a resident of Southern Utah, raised in San Antonio, Texas. She describes her method of finding inspiration for her work in exploring possibilities in movement and finding joy in nature. She travels extensively and seeks out the people, artistic influences and natural history to bring forth works that display all she has seen. She integrates her travel photographs into her work.

Paulette uses many elements when creating pieces, including printed fabrics, textiles, beads and thread painting to create vivid pictures that reflect the sights and feelings of her world journeys. Her work invites the viewer to become lost in the details of each piece and find an endless number of patterns and abstract natural features.

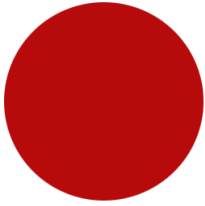

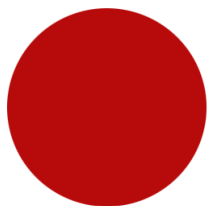
Talk by Ray Campeau,

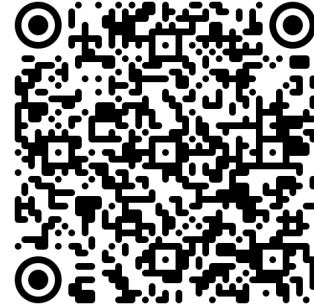

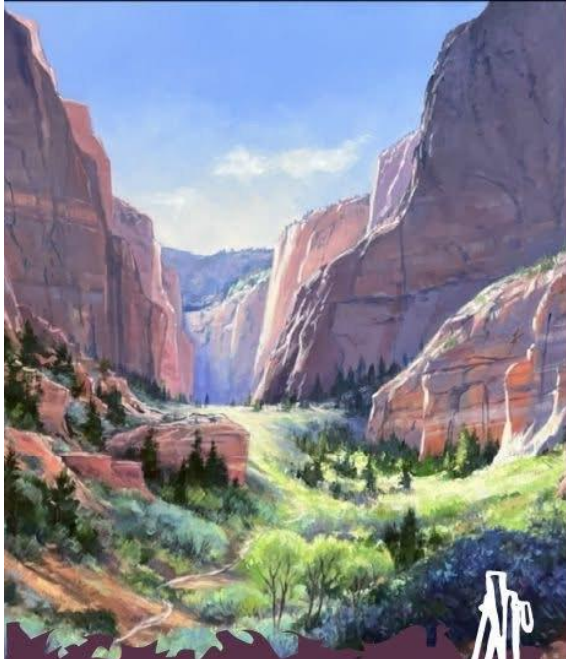

4-Week Series: Drawing and Composition for Beginners / Carol Bold

3/10, 3/17, 3/24, 3/31 @ 10 am - 12 pm

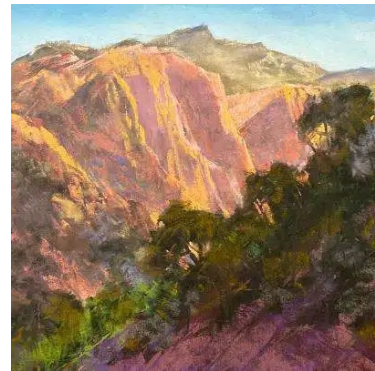

Carol will cover the basic drawing elements including line, shape, form, space, texture, and color, as well as work towards more complex structures, compositions, and concepts. This class is ideal for beginning drawing students.



3-Day Pastel Workshop: The Joy of Plein Air / Arlene Braithwaite

March 12, 13, 14 @ 10am - 2pm

Join local artist Arlene Braithwaite in the joyful experience of painting outdoors with pastels! Students will paint for two hours in the morning on location, learning techniques for capturing changing light and recording the essence of a place at a particular moment in time. After a break for lunch, the class will continue in the studio, where students will finish their on-site painting. They may also start a new painting based on their photographic reference from the morning. All ability levels are welcome. The class will meet at the studio on the morning of the first day.



Micro Mosaic Jewelry / Joyce Casey

March 15th, 2025 (Saturday @ 10am - 1pm

Expand your artistic skills by making micro-mosaic jewelry, perfect for the gifting season! You will be given step-by-step instructions on how to create up to 3 pendants using charms, glass, stones, wire, and other design elements provided. You will learn how to cut glass and how to make mosaic pendants using a putty technique. These pieces can be used for pendants, key chains, or magnets to make special keepsakes and gifts. All supplies included. Joyce will supply several completed samples and pictures for inspiration.

Encaustics Sculpture / Kathy Johnson
March 26, April 2, 2025 (Wednesdays) @ 1pm - 5pm

Experiment with encaustics while creating your own original three-dimensional sculpture. Starting with a general form, your unique sculpture will take shape with the help of plaster, encaustic wax, and various embellishments. In the first session, you will create your form. After a week of drying time, the second session will focus on sealing the form and adding finishing touches. Don't worry if you are not a "sculptor!" You will soon be a Master of Plaster.



Ivins Plein Air Oil Painting / Steven Anzardo
March 28 & 29 @ 10am - 12pm (Friday)
& 9am - 12pm (Saturday)

This workshop will cover the basics of Plein Air painting, with an emphasis on perceiving and expressing the visual subtleties of our surroundings. On the first day, we will meet at the studio for 2 hours to discuss, demo, and practice. On the second day, we will meet on location for 2-3 hours at a nearby scenic area. We will discuss ideas of composition as we settle into our painting position. During this time, we will address lighting dynamics, arrangement of design, and color palette selection.



Our class will end with a group critique of the work. *This class is for artists of all levels. Instructor demonstrations will be in oil paint, but all mediums are welcome.*

And be sure to check out the exciting three-day print making workshop coming in March that will be taught by popular visiting artist Linda Tay'nahza
